EASTWOOD NATURE TRAIL

Want to get out in nature, but don't want the long car ride?

Then come walk the Eastwood Nature Trail! The trail is located directly east of the Eastwood Elementary campus in Roseburg. There won't be guided tours or group activities, but temporary signage on this day will lead you to videos, documents and other fascinating facts about the area. Make sure you have your camera and QR coder ready!



What is there to see? Deer Creek runs through the campus and the area has a fish hatchery which is used intermittently throughout the year. The area also includes a Native American Plank House and Drumming circle. Walk through the Ponderosa Pine forest and possibly, catch a view of the turtles and birds that often frequent the pond. View videos of local students sharing what they know about each of the stations.

Note: The trail is open to the public on other days, but not during school hours (M-F 8:00-4:00)
